Providing Quality Eyewear Options as Part of URE Solution

OneSight believes that clear vision should be a reality for everyone. That's why OneSight volunteers work to preserve and restore clear vision for those in need around the world. Through our close affiliation with Luxottica, OneSight volunteers use their unique business and optical expertise to provide primary vision care and eyewear for each patient.

OneSight's eyewear inventory includes new and ready-made, readers, sunglasses, new round frames, lenses and other options for new eyewear manufactured on-site. One aspect of OneSight assistance includes refurbished eyewear collected at Luxottica retail stores, wholesale and partner locations for use on Global Eye Care Clinics and Projects. High quality refurbished eyewear is offered as one option for patients along with the other options listed above.

Why does OneSight use multiple options for eyewear?

In many countries, one pair of eyewear costs more than a month's salary. That's why OneSight combines its resources along with the generosity of others to meet the needs of those who cannot afford, or do not have access to primary vision care and eyewear. We believe the solution involves options for the patient. Gently used eyewear refurbished to OneSight's strict quality standards is frequently higher quality than low cost new eyewear, especially Luxottica manufactured product donated by customers.

How is refurbished eyewear checked for quality?

Donated eyewear is consolidated at one of 15 OneSight Global Resource Centers where trained volunteers and skilled technicians take each donated pair of eyewear through a multi-step process to ensure the highest quality. Each pair is:

- Thoroughly cleaned in an optical-grade cleansing machine.
- Adjusted, repaired and reviewed against strict standards including physical appearance (size, flaking or chipped varnish/coating) and usability (frame durability/strength, unscratched lenses).

Eyewear that passes our strict quality standards are read by a Lensometer to identify the prescription, and then catalogued in OneSight's proprietary inventory database.

What happens to refurbished eyewear that does not meet quality standards?

Eyewear that does not pass OneSight's quality standards are not used on Global Eye Care Clinics and Project work and are never dispensed to patients. In most cases, the raw material of eyewear not meeting standards is recycled in an environmentally friendly way.

How is eyewear distributed to patients?

All patients served during OneSight Clinics receive a thorough eye exam from a licensed optometrist to determine if eyewear is needed. During Global Clinics/Projects, optometrists work with trained volunteers to select eyewear that will best improve vision based on each patient's prescription. The right eyewear is selected through OneSight's proprietary computerized system. Selected eyewear is adjusted and checked against patient need to ensure the best fit for the patient.

How much eyewear does OneSight have in stock?

OneSight's current stock includes more than 200,000 pair of glasses both refurbished and new, 1 million frames and 350,000 lenses. On average, over 30,000 pairs of eyewear, new and refurbished, are taken to each Global Clinic to serve approximately 10,000 patients. Inventory is selected based on historical data collected over OneSight's 20+ year history conducting Clinics and through partnerships with local organizations. This data enables OneSight to select eyewear that will most benefit the needs of a specific region.

How does OneSight's use of a variety of eyewear types and delivery of eyewear respect the dignity of the patient?

OneSight believes offering choice of quality options and providing comprehensive and sustainable care through

partnerships with local organizations respects the dignity of each patient. Patients suffering from uncorrected refractive error work with the doctor and OneSight volunteer to determine the solution to best meet their need—a pair of readers, refurbished eyewear or a new pair of glasses.

Why is the cost for refurbished eyewear not as high for OneSight as it is for other organizations?

OneSight is an organization of Luxottica, a world leader in manufacturing of frames and parent company of many retail optical stores. Because of this, OneSight uses professional technicians, opticians and skilled workers to refurbish eyewear and train volunteers. Cleaning, repairing and reading the Rx is of the highest quality resulting from skilled labor using optical grade equipment and tools. OneSight does not rent warehouse space, hire transportation or specific workers to refurbish, ship or store eyewear. OneSight leverages the business expertise, resources and regular business processes that occur regardless of OneSight activity.

What does the future hold for OneSight and the eyewear given to patients around the world?

OneSight's process and production of eyewear is evolving and expanding through OneSight's large network of Global Resource Centers. OneSight will remain committed to providing quality care, including offering quality eyewear, both new and refurbished, that preserves the dignity of each patient. Volunteers remain dedicated to raising awareness of eye care, providing eyewear that is accessible and affordable and partnering with local organizations to ensure sustainable care.



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
