## Gather volunteers to “Scare Up” used glasses:

- Ask organizations, such as local sport teams, student councils and clubs to help you collect used glasses.
- Teachers and Scout Troop leaders: Offer community service hours or a service/recycling patch to volunteers.

- We’re looking for complete pairs (no pieces missing) of mens, womens and childrens prescription glasses and non-prescription sunglasses.
- Be on the prowl, used glasses are everywhere! Collect from schools, places of worship, local businesses, gyms or recreation centers, senior citizens centers, and lost and found bins at malls, movie theaters and airports.
